


#### The Track

The lap record is held by Jon Leighton driving a Cooper Climax in Oct 1960 av speed 105.2mph (178.1kph)






#### Start Line


The start is located on Huntly Road near the present-day playground



Sir Jack Brabham started racing here and held the lap record up until the final race








































## The first Touring Car round


In January 1960, the first Australian Touring Car Championship (now the V8s) was run at Gnoo Blas along with the first race for the new class for Grand Touring cars.

David McKay won from Bill Pitt and Ron Hodgson, all in Jaguars, in an action-packed race.

McKay recorded 132.7mph on the long straight.












































